CO An interview with the Hotel Britomart's General Manager (Clinton Farley, 03/11/20)

Transcript

The hotel Britomart has been recognized as a five green star hotel by the New-Zealand building council. What they recognize is the construction practices that were put in place through the development of the hotel. So anywhere from using materials that may have been on site, like concrete that has been recycled, through to ensuring that anything removed from site was done in a sustainable way.

Further to that, it's things down to the plant and equipment that's been installed at the hotel, the insulation in the building, the windows used.

And we haven't just left it there, we've really taken that right through to everything that we've done, and operationally in the hotel. For example, beside me here we have a beautiful tree **when this tree grows too large for here, we'll replant** that up in the bay of islands at our property the landing.

Other things that we have at the hotel, are **complimentary bicycles**, and then moving into the **guest rooms** we've really tried to be as sustainable as possible as well. So, we've worked with a company called **eco linen**, who have imported **100 organic cotton sheeting**, and looking at the **pillows** in our bedrooms, they're made from a **microfiber** and one pillow there's about **45 recycled plastic bottles**. Our **duvets** are also **microfiber** from that same source.

From an **amenity** point of view, we really thought outside the square, we didn't want to import a whole lot of **shampoos and conditioners** in the small mini bottles. We've worked with a **local company** here in Auckland called sans cuticles. The product is **locally made, locally sourced**.

And that's what we've really tried to do with everything operationally here at the hotel, even through to food and beverage, and really showcase the best of New-Zealand the hotel Britomart is really excited to be committed to the Tiaki Promise, which is really tourism New Zealand's way of promoting New-Zealand as a sustainable place that cares for people, culture and place.

We've really instilled those values through everything that we've done here at the hotel.

What does Tiaki mean?

Tiaki means to care for people and place. New Zealanders have a special connection to the land, and want to help visitors travel safely and conscientiously. The Tiaki Promise has a set of guiding principles for visitors to follow, showing them how to contribute to preserving and protecting our land.

Who created the Tiaki Promise?

Seven private and public sector organisations came together to create the Tiaki Promise: Tourism New Zealand, Air New Zealand, the Department of Conservation, Tourism Industry Aotearoa, Local Government New Zealand, New Zealand Māori Tourism and Tourism Holdings Ltd.
